

## Suffolk RE Curriculum Map

- The Suffolk syllabus stipulates the following coverage:

During Reception, pupils must begin their enquiries into Christianity and other major religions or worldviews. Six 'big' questions must be asked in Reception.

During Key Stage 1, pupils must enquire into Christianity x3 per year, Judaism x2 per year, Islam x1 and one other religion or worldview (e.g., Buddhism, Sikhism, Hinduism or Humanism) as chosen by the school and which may vary from year to year.

During Key Stage 2, pupils must enquire into Christianity x2 per year, Islam, Hinduism x1 per year, Judaism, Buddhism, Sikhism and Humanism x2 each across KS2
