Maths:

We will be learning to work with fractions and decimals including; finding equivalent fractions, comparing and ordering fractions and decimals, adding and subtraction fractions and converting mixed numbers into fractions.


We will also be developing our understanding of 3-D shapes by recognising their properties including; the shapes that make them up and the angles which are part of them.

Whilst working with measurements, we will be converting measures into both metric and imperial measurements as well as finding the area and perimeter of shapes.

Finally, we will look at presenting data in graphs and tables whilst completing work around statistics.

English:

We are very lucky to be reading some excellent texts this half-term which also link to our topic-based learning.


This half-term, our topic is Vile Victorians.

The Victorians were the people who lived during the reign of Queen Victoria, from the 20 June 1837 until the date of her death on the 22 January 1901. It was an era of exciting discoveries, inventions and exploration following the Industrial Revolution.

We will explore how Britain's empire grew and changed as a result of the Industrial Revolution, discovering how this impacted the life of all people during the Victorian Era. We will investigate the lives of children during the time; including those within our locality.
