A message from the **PRINCIPAL**

Dear Parents/Carers,

Welcome to our November newsletter. It really has been a busy month full of staff training and exciting ideas.

The month started with some staff training organised by Mr. Thomas for our teaching assistants on children's early communication skills. This was swiftly followed by more training for Mr Smith to further enhance our PE and Sports curriculum for our pupils. Mrs. Bailey also held an Eco Council meeting early in November and Year 2 had a visit from a Rugby coach which made for an exciting PE lesson! On 3rd November Year 4 went on a very exciting visit to West Stow Anglo Saxon village as part of their History learning and our Early Years Team held an Open Evening for prospective parents which was very well attended with lots of good feedback about Beck Row which was lovely to hear. The National Child Measurement Team were in to get some useful data from our Year 6 pupils and a few children from Year 1 gave a super performance at a Dance competition in Mildenhall. On the 9th November the whole school took part in a fabulous Art Day organised by Ms Petch ready for our Art Gallery exhibition in December and Ms Petch's Art Club on Thursday began. Later that week the Occupational Therapist visited a few pupils in school to support them and training was delivered to our Teaching Assistants in a new Lego therapy intervention being offered at Beck Row for selected pupils as well as Speech Ladder training for selected staff.

The following week we held our first Parent Consultation meetings of the year and it was lovely to see parents and carers in school celebrating and supporting our children's learning. Ms Petch attended training to work towards Beck Row achieving the Music Mark accreditation and Mr Thomas travelled to Ipswich to attend training lead by a national leader in supporting pupils with special educational needs and disabilities. We held assemblies

for Anti-bullying week and Road Safety week. Mr Smith and Mr Thomas took a group of pupils to a multi-skills sports event and Ms Petch attended a meeting to start the process of Beck Row achieving our Artsmark award. We rounded off the week with Children in Need dress-up day on 18th November.

The final full week of November started with Mr Thomas our SENDCo going on a very useful visit to Forest school in Brandon to observe their excellent work around pupil mental health, well-being and sensory needs. We will be rolling out some of the same initiatives at Beck Row in the coming weeks. The Open the Book team visited at the start of the week with an assembly for the children on the Christmas story and our local Schools Police Liaison officer delivered an assembly to our Year 5 and 6 pupils. Mr Thomas met with leaders from the SENDIASS parent advice group and the Health team were in school again to administer flu vaccinations to any pupils who didn't get a chance to get vaccinated on their last visit. More Lego Therapy staff training took place and Mr Thomas met with other SENDCos as part of a cluster of Cambridgeshire schools sharing good practice in our work with pupils who need extra support. The school nurse visited to meet with a pupil and Suffolk Special Education Service visited to observe pupils across our early years setting.

We enjoyed a lovely assembly on Advent given by Reverends Caroline and David last week and they were kind enough to remain in school to support Year 2 with their RE lesson afterwards. Speaking of Christmas, please note all the dates for various Christmas events in this Newsletter. We are especially looking forward to our Nativity performances by early years and KS1 pupils. I have heard them rehearsing and they sound amazing!

They shall grow not old, as we that are left grow old: Age shall not weary them, nor the years condemn. At the going down of the sun and in the morning We will remember them.



Online safety

Our aim as parents, carers and teachers is to keep our children safe. This is the same for the online world. We all know that the current world is heavily technology based and this will only get bigger. We want our children to grow up with technology being second nature, however with this we also know how important it is for our children to know safe practices online as well as in everyday life. At home, sometimes children can be given unsupervised access to the Internet. This, potentially, allows them to access all kinds of society (both good and bad) and bring them virtually into their homes. We would encourage you to talk to your children about what they are doing online, always encourage your child to be online in a shared area so you can work together. It's essential to be realistic banning the internet or technology will not work and it often makes a child less likely to report a problem. Education around safe use is essential.
