Hello Parents, Staff and Students of Beck Row,

As we reach the end of this term, I wanted to take a moment to express my heartfelt thanks to each and every one of you for the incredible dedication, hard work, and progress we have achieved together. It has been an absolute pleasure to join this wonderful school community and serve as your principal during the Autumn term.

The progress across the school has been nothing short of phenomenal. Year 1 has shown great determination in improving their phonics results, with children passing rising from 50% to 62%. Year 2 has been truly outstanding, with an increase from 44% to an impressive 78% passing. Our Year 4 students have made a remarkable leap in their MTC results, improving from just 6% to 42%. And in Year 6, the commitment to learning has shone through in their maths SATs performance, increasing from 57% to 72%.

These accomplishments are a testament to the relentless effort of our students and the unwavering support of the staff. But these are just a few highlights. Reception, you are the most well-behaved cohort I have ever known, setting an example for the entire school. Your strides in writing in Years 3 and 5, have been inspiring, with Year 3 even scoring above the national average – a truly fantastic achievement! And year 5, you are all so polite and respectful.

This term has been a time of growth, learning, and success, and I am incredibly proud of all that we have achieved together. To the staff, your passion and dedication have made all the difference, and to the students, your enthusiasm and hard work have brought our school community to new heights.



As we look ahead to the Spring term, I am filled with excitement and optimism for what we will accomplish next. For now, I wish you all a joyful and restful Christmas break. Take this time to relax, celebrate, and recharge.

SEND Supporting a child who find Christmas overwhelming

Christmas can be hard for your child if they struggle with crowds, noises and changes in routine. The festive period can be overwhelming for autistic children and children with ADHD, sensory issues or anxiety. It can help to plan and adapt your celebrations around your child's need.

Make a list

Make a list of what your child finds difficult. The list will be unique to your child because every child will cope with Christmas in different ways. Try to think about when they might experience these things. Think about whether you can avoid those situations or help your child prepare.

Prepare them for gifts

Some children find surprise gifts overwhelming. You might want to let them know what type of gifts they will open and when this will happen. For example, you could tell them you will give them a book and the surprise is which book you choose. It can also help to:

- Spread gift giving over the day or different days
- Give gifts with out wrapping
- Allow them to open gifts away form other people.
- Talk to friends and family to explain that your child's response to gifts may not be what they expect.

Involve your child in decisions

Involve your child in some decisions. For example, ask them to help you choose decorations they feel comfortable with. This could be lights, colours and textures.

Speak to their school

Find out what's happening at your child's school could this include shows, parties, lunches or Christmas jumper days.

This could become overwhelming for some children. If you feel your child may need extra support during these times, try to speak to the school before the event so they can plan to support your child.

Plan for visitors and outings

If your child struggles with people visiting your home or going out, think about how you can help. You could:

- see if your child wants to stay at home with another family member when you go out
- ask if they want to play in a different room
- let your child stay with you if they want to when at other houses

Create a safe space

Keep at least one room in the house free of decoration. Try to make sure it looks like it usually does. This can be a safe space for your child if they feel overwhelmed.

Manage change in routine

Prepare your child each day for what's coming the next day. Talk to them about who will be there, what they will do and what they'll eat. If your child uses picture cards or sign language to communicate, start using signs for the new activities ahead of time to help their understanding.




